## CHAPTER HOUSE IS UNDERWAY

*Alumni Support Needed for Remaining \$500,000 to Complete Fundraising Goal*

As we go to press for this edition of the Constantine Sig, I am pleased to report great progress with the renovation of your Psi of Sigma Chi Chapter House. When completed later this fall, we will have a new Chapter Room and a new multi-purpose entertainment space to serve our Active and Alumni Brothers. Thanks to the untiring work of our contractor and Brother **Bret Holden '83**, construction work has progressed

at a steady rate since our groundbreaking in May 2016. Special thanks also goes to **Mike Christian '77**, who is providing essential building materials for this project through his company, Massey Builders Supply. If you have had a chance to visit 608 Preston Place this fall, you know that the new building is “out of the ground” and its first floor framing is underway. In addition, a separate bathroom facility, for the exclusive use of the new addition, is being installed in the basement of our existing Chapter House, and the joists under the living room and former dining room have been reinforced and strengthened. A new electric service for the existing house has been installed, and a new laundry facility has been built in the Chapter House basement. As the accompanying photos illustrate, the dream of renovating and enlarging our venerable Chapter House is quickly becoming a reality!

I also want to report that we have made great progress with our “Honoring Our Past, Building our Future” Capital Campaign to provide the funding for our work. We are extremely thankful

for the response of the 206 generous donors who have contributed just over \$1.5 million dollars. However, support from every Psi Brother will be needed if we are going to raise the remaining \$500,000 to reach our two million dollar fundraising goal. To date, participation by Psi Alumni, in support of our Capital Campaign, is at 19%, while the average Greek fundraising Capital Campaign has 25% participation.

The finish line for this first phase of the total renovation and modernization of 608 Preston Place is in sight, as we plan to formally dedicate the new Chapter Room in December 2016. However, in order to get there, we need the help of all Psi Brothers in a collaborative effort reaching across all generations to improve our participation rate. To those who have not yet made a gift, we strongly encourage your thoughtful consideration to support this project. Participation by all our Brothers is now our top priority with gifts at all levels of generosity greatly appreciated.



## VICKI WARREN WASHBURN

JANUARY 15, 1949 – APRIL 5, 2016

The girl of my dreams is the sweetest girl  
Of all the girls I know.  
Each sweet coed, like a rainbow trail  
Fades in the afterglow.  
The blue of her eyes and gold of her hair  
Are a blend of the western sky.  
And the moonlight beams  
On the girl of my dreams  
She's the Sweetheart of Sigma Chi.

There's much to learn from the best among us. Vicki Washburn was one of those people. It is with deep regret that we must tell you that Vicki died on April 5, 2016 after a brief, but courageous, battle with cancer.

To all who visited 608 Preston Place in the late 1960's, Vicki was everyone's best friend. Years before women were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences for their undergraduate education, Vicki was the most constant female presence in the House. Everyone's sister, friend, and confidante, it's hard to remember a weekend without Vicki's smiling face greeting us at the front door.

Of course, the real reason Vicki traveled to Charlottesville from Lynchburg College, and later American University each weekend, was to visit her then boyfriend, Brother **Tom Washburn '70**, who met Vicki when she was fifteen and in the tenth grade and he was seventeen and in the eleventh grade at their alma mater Hammond High School in Alexandria, Virginia. Legend has it that, after the first date for each of them, they were inseparable for the rest of her life.

In Spring 1969, Vicki was unanimously selected as our Sweetheart of Sigma Chi. At that time, the University of Virginia was a notorious all-male public institution, with the

majority of us Virginia Gentlemen, as we were paradoxically known, completely ignorant as to what equality between a man and a woman really meant. Enter Vicki Warren Washburn. By winning our hearts, as she did in the most unassuming way, Vicki taught us all the wonder of being a woman. She was smart, she was kind, she was wise and she singlehandedly became the teacher of respect, dignity, and equality between a man and a woman.

In her death, Vicki leaves behind her beloved husband Tom, her daughter Brooke Housh and son-in-law Steve, her son Trent, her son Peter and daughter-in-law Mandy, six grandchildren, and her precious Annie, the golden retriever daughter.

So, this is the story of Vicki. Simply put, being loved by Vicki was transformative. She had a way of seeing the best in people and showing them the path to see it in themselves. Her infectious love of life was perfectly captured in an e-mail exchange between friends after, as Tom put it, she had "left." "I know Vicki will have a fun time in heaven giggling with her new angel buddies," wrote the first. To which the other replied, "... having fun in heaven giggling and dancing with her new angel buddies!" Because, as we all know, Vicki always loved a good party!

## A LOYAL BROTHER

*Don Sours '58 Encourages All Psi Alumni to Reconnect*

When **Don Sours '58** joined the Psi Chapter of Sigma Chi in 1955, he was impressed by its smart, witty, fun-loving members, who were also in positions of leadership on the Grounds. It was that composite of what it meant to be a Sigma Chi that led him to rush, then pledge in our Fraternity, a decision that has placed Sigma Chi at the center of his life ever since.

“As a Boy Scout, our troop leader taught us to always leave the woodpile higher than you found it. I saw this same attitude at Psi Chapter,” Don said. And that’s how he has treated his relationship with the Chapter since becoming a Brother almost sixty years ago. “The older Brothers encouraged me to participate in activities at the University and pursue positions of leadership,” he said. “I’ve never forgotten their wisdom and encouragement.”

Don frequently visits Psi Chapter and notes the current undergraduates are a group of fine and intelligent men. He has never stopped giving back to the Chapter that has meant so much to him throughout his adult life. “I encourage our 1,100 living Psi Alumni to re-establish contact with our Fraternity that has meant so much to us and whose principles helped guide us as young adults to enjoy giving back to our community,” Don said. “If you have lost touch with Psi, now is the time to reconnect. You are missing out on a lot of opportunities to help our undergraduate Brothers.”

Don believes that the decision to join Sigma Chi gave him the opportunity to identify with his Brothers of high character and emulate the principles of the Fraternity, both of which helped shape him into who he is today. “We want Sigma Chi to continue to lead the Virginia Greek System in all areas of life at the University, both in and out of the classroom,” Don said, adding “and that includes being in a fraternity that promotes the fraternal



benefits of living in a fully modernized and safe home away from home.”

Don’s commitment to the Psi Chapter has never wavered, nor has it gone unrecognized. In 1998, at the forty-seventh Grand Chapter, he was inducted into the Order of Constantine, considered to be the highest honor that the Sigma Chi Fraternity bestows upon a Brother for his commitment, dedication, and service to the Fraternity. In doing so, Don joined three other Psi Brothers previously elected to the Order, **Robert Harmon '23**, inducted in 1950, **Malcolm Christian '49**, inducted in 1963, and **Robert Fair '50**, inducted in 2014.

Don’s devotion to Psi of Sigma Chi continues into the present. He has spent the last thirty-five years on the Psi of Sigma Chi House Corporation, having earlier spent twenty-five years as its President. He now is a member of the House Corporation Building Committee, helping with our current renovation of the Chapter House.

Capital Campaign co-chairman, **Steve Herbert '68**, is proud to call Don his Sigma Chi Brother. “Don Sours has served our Psi Chapter with great distinction, dedication, and loyalty through all of his adult life,” Steve said. “His current involvement with the ongoing expansion and renovation of the Chapter House, after his many years of leadership on the House Corporation Board of Directors, is a remarkable achievement that is greatly appreciated by all Psi Actives and Alumni.”

Honor Committee, Habitat for Humanity, Homers for Hoos, and Seeds of Hope. This past year, our philanthropic event, "Derby Days," had its most profitable year ever raising \$29,000 for the U.Va. Children's Miracle Network. We also continued to be enthusiastic supporters of other Greek philanthropies around the Grounds

such as the Alpha Phi Thankful 5K. For the upcoming academic year, the Psi Chapter of Sigma Chi Brotherhood will continue our long tradition of serving and participating within the volunteer organizations of the Charlottesville and University of Virginia communities.
