As this issue of *The Constantine Sig* goes to press, we are pleased to announce that the contributions to *Psi Chapter: Honoring Our Past, Building Our Future* Capital Campaign total \$1,619,436. This impressive number has been made possible by the generous contributions of 240 Brothers and friends of the Chapter allowing us to complete and dedicate Phase 1 of our project. The new Donlan-Kirwin Memorial Chapter Room and the associated social spaces, outdoor terraces, and new parking lot are proving to be wise investments as the active Brotherhood now enjoys modern and efficient social facilities unmatched by other fraternities at the University.

As other articles in this edition confirm, the current Brotherhood is enjoying a very successful year with a very large pledge class totaling 25 new members. With this increasing membership, it is time to move ahead with Phase 2, the final phase of the campaign and the Chapter House renovation. This phase focuses on the living spaces inside 608 and includes a new kitchen dining facility, new heating

and air conditioning systems, and upgrades to bathroom facilities. An addition to the rear of the building will include new single bedrooms allowing a total house occupancy of 21 Brothers. Architects' plans are nearly complete and cost estimates are being prepared. A project start date is targeted for the summer of 2019.

To make this happen, we will need to raise an additional \$400,000 to meet our original capital campaign goal of \$2,000,000. The House Corporation Board of Directors and the capital campaign leadership believe this goal is achievable. Look for more information on Phase 2 giving opportunities in the coming months and call or email us if you can help us meet this giving goal and finish our work at 608 Preston Place.


REFLECTIONS ON PSI CHAPTER MEMORIES

I arrived at UVA in the fall of 1977. Being a Jersey boy, the last thing I planned to do was join a fraternity. But **Bob Crumplar '78**, senior to me in my Navy ROTC chain of command, extended an invitation to visit Sigma Chi, so I went and kept going. I enjoyed the tremendous camaraderie of the Brothers. They clearly enjoyed each other's company. It was a diverse group that bonded immensely well. Those '78, '79, and '80 fellas knew how to have fun, and I wanted to be part of the magic. I even got an early bid despite introducing myself to **Mickey Furey '81** and referring to him as the President of Sigma Chi. He immediately corrected me—stating that he was actually the Consul of the Psi Chapter!

The only official position I held was Kitchen Manager and that was only because **Mark Echelberger '79**, my predecessor, asked for volunteers and everyone else ran for the hills. Aside from ROTC, my time was devoted to Sigma Chi. I guess I assumed an unofficial "assistant social chairman" role, taking over as Thumper Leader from **Sean Dwyer '78**, helping build many bonfires to "roast" fellow Brothers and ensuring Scott Stadium had ice cold draft beer during football games. Intramurals were fun, and we did well across the board. A roll to Clemson with half a dozen Brothers during my fourth year brought back what we titled the Road Trip Boogie – and it spread like wildfire among the sororities.

As a Psi pledge studying the *Norman Shield*, much of it resonated with me and my faith. I learned the primary purpose of Sigma Chi is to promote



friendship, justice, and learning. The Jordan Standard is a great template with which to live life, and it certainly influenced many aspects of my 25-year USMC career. It definitely applies to the dozens of Psis with whom I maintain close contact. I can honestly say they are all great friends and men "of good character, with properly placed ambitious purposes, congenial dispositions, possessed of good morals, having high senses of honor and deep senses of personal responsibility." Most of us were definitely students of fair ability (that's a C average, right?)...and the successes of my Brothers are amazing.

I had a wonderful time during college and that's primarily due to being a Psi. Since then, the dozens of Brothers I continue to call friends have brightened my life. I have gotten a great return on my initial investment and want to give back to ensure future generations of Psis will be as fortunate. I keep in mind our Creed: "I believe in fairness, decency and good manners. I will endeavor to retain the spirit of youth. I will try to make my college, the Sigma Chi Fraternity, and my own Chapter more honored by all men and women and more beloved and honestly respected by our own Brothers. I say these words in all sincerity: That Sigma Chi has given me favor and distinction; that the bond of our fellowship is reciprocal, that I will endeavor to so build myself and so conduct myself that I will ever be a credit to our Fraternity."

CHAPTER ADDITIONS CREATE MORE SPACE FOR BROTHERHOOD EXPERIENCES

Psi Raises \$23,000 for UVA Children's Hospital

After a very successful 2017-18 school year, the Psi Chapter of Sigma Chi is aiming to end the spring semester on a strong note. The Brothers of Psi Chapter continue to be intensely involved at the University of Virginia. Our membership includes varsity athletes, dedicated volunteers, and high-achieving students who consistently reflect well on our fraternity.

New Additions Benefit Philanthropy and Strengthen Brotherhood

The new social space and Chapter Room at 608 Preston Place have opened up exciting opportunities for the Psi Chapter over this past year. While the expanded outside area is certainly great for social events, it represents something much more important to the Brotherhood. For example, we were able to utilize this new space for our Derby Days philanthropy this year, allowing us to connect with an increased number of community members in an effort to raise money for the UVA Children's Hospital. This year we were very happy to provide over \$23,000 to this great cause, an increase over last year's total. The new Chapter Room has also been a valuable addition to the Psi Chapter, as Brothers have taken full advantage of this new study space. No matter the time of day, Brothers can be found in the Chapter Room enjoying each other's friendship and strengthening the bonds of our Brotherhood.

On-Campus Involvement

Our Brothers take great pride in being active, contributing members of the Charlottesville community. Many Brothers are involved in volunteer work through Madison House programs that range from coaching youth lacrosse and basketball, to volunteering at the local Sentara Martha Jefferson Hospital. The Psi Chapter also has Brothers serving as student tutors, counselors with Camp Kesem, and even one Brother acting as the community service chair of UVA's chapter of the National Health Pre-professional Honor Society.

The Brotherhood is also very involved in athletic pursuits here at the University of Virginia. There are multiple Brothers playing on the varsity squash team, as well as the varsity basketball team. In addition, a great number of Brothers participate on club sports teams, including club lacrosse, soccer, basketball, rugby, hockey, and skiing. Two Brothers also serve as the captains of the varsity squash and club rugby teams.

In addition, our Brothers invest a significant amount of time in extracurricular organizations outside of Sigma Chi. Examples of these activities include NROTC, One Goal, Camp Kesem, Pancakes for Parkinson's, IFC, Fill the Hill, McIntire Investment Institute, and more. As the current school year comes to an end, the Psi Chapter is proud to uphold a longstanding tradition of service and leadership within both the Charlottesville and UVA communities.

Academic Success

The Psi Chapter meets the academic challenge presented by the University of Virginia with eagerness and determination. Our Brotherhood includes Jefferson and Rodman Scholars, as well as a host of Brothers pursuing challenging majors. Many of our Brothers were recently accepted into the McIntire School of Commerce and the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy. There are numerous Brothers involved in local scientific research, and a number of our members have secured internships with major companies in cities like Washington D.C., New York, and Boston.

Looking Ahead

Looking towards the future, the Psi Chapter is working in coordination with the Inter-Sorority Council to expand Derby Days philanthropic participation outside of the traditional Greek Community. We will be reaching out to various student organizations, as well as NPHC chapters, the historically African American fraternities and sororities, and MGC chapters, which are dedicated to specific multicultural communities. Not only will this affirm our commitment to an inclusive and empowering philanthropy experience, it will expand our participation base and provide the potential to raise even more money to benefit the UVA Children's Hospital. We are very excited about the opportunity to improve the philanthropy experience and tap into the greater energy and resources of the Charlottesville community as a whole.
